Nomination Process for the 21st Century Achievement Awards



21st Century Achievement Awards

Nominations submitted by Chairmen Committee Companies are evaluated to ensure they conform to the Computerworld Honors Program standards. Those in compliance are requested to compose a case study. Limited numbers of case studies are accepted and given "Laureate" status. An independent board of judges evaluates all Laureates' case studies designating the top five in each of the ten categories as finalists. The June event culminates with one award recipient in each category selected by the judges as first among their peers and receives the 21st Century Achievement Award.

All Laureate case studies are included in the Computerworld Honors Program Online Archives and the Global Archives representing more than 350 institutions worldwide.

Ten Categories for Nominations

- Education and Academia (Universities, Colleges and K-12)
- Environment, Energy and Agriculture (Forestry, Fisheries, Utilities, Mining, Oil and Gas)
- Finance, Insurance and Real Estate (Banking, Accounting and Legal Services)
- Government (Military, Federal, State and Local Governments)
- Healthcare (Consumer Health, Pharmaceutical, Biotech, Technology and Research Industries)
- Manufacturing
- Media, Arts and Entertainment (Advertising, PR, Hospitality and Recreation)
- Non-Profit Organizations
- Transportation (Shipping, Automobile, Aviation, Boat and Rail)

How the program works

- 100 Chairmen/CEOs from top information technology companies make up the Computerworld Honors **Chairmen's Committee**.
- Each Chairmen's Committee member or company submits **nominations** for the people or organizations they feel demonstrated extraordinary use of information technology that benefited society this past year.
- From the field of nominations, roughly **250-300 Laureates** are chosen and are honored at the medal ceremony in June.
- From the field of Laureates, **50 Finalists** are selected – five for each of the ten categories of the awards.
- Finalists and members of the Chairmen's Committee, along with other industry luminaries, come together for the awards ceremony and gala event June 7, 2010, where the **Finalists and ten 21st Century Achievement Award Recipients** are announced.
